League of Women Voters of New York Convention Report

The LWVNY 53rd Biennial Convention was held in Syracuse, from May 15 – 17, 2009. Eighty five delegates attended, representing 31 local leagues and 3 ILO's (Inter League organizations). Ten state board members also attended.

President Martha Kennedy discussed the decreases in membership and in corporate and donor funding. She stated that it was a hard decision, but PMP (per Member Payment) was not raised for next year. In order to reduce expenses, the printing of Voter will be suspended. At the start of the convention the LWVNY's 08-09 budget had an \$18K deficit. As a result of the convention's raffle and silent auction, the deficit improved to \$11.8K. Letters were sent to all Leagues, after the convention, requesting local Leagues donate funds to make up the deficit in this year's budget.

There was a great deal of discussion about the budget. Delegates commented that no financial information about the Reserve and LWVNY Education Funds appeared in the convention packet, and requested that it be included in future packets.

The existing Program was retained. An up to two year study of the Consolidation of Governmental Units and Services was approved.

The "Moments in The Sun" (Local League accomplishments during the year) included: demonstration of new voting machines, voting displays in a library right before election time, scholarship funds for civic minded students, a luncheon honoring women in government, cosponsoring a movie, *America's Victoria*, holding environmental forums by partnering with local high schools, a seminar on how to run for public office, a League table at local farmer's market, information about Energy Options – solar panels and tax credits, a healthcare forum, a Constitution Day event with a panel of legislators, and during women's history month, organizing a panel of women who are in or were in public office to discuss the barriers for women who want to run for office.

During incoming President Betsey Swan's speech, she mentioned that a focus of her term will be to bridge the gap between state and local leagues.

There were several speakers at the convention. John Clarkson, who served as executive Director of the Lundine Commission and who is currently with the State Comptroller's Office, in the Office of Budget and Policy Analysis, spoke about the benefits to municipalities from consolidation and shared services. Senator David Valesky, Vice President Pro Tempore of the Senate, also spoke. Jay Gallagher, a journalist with the Capitol Bureau of the Gannett New Service which covers NY state government and politics for eight Gannett papers in NY and five non-Gannett clients, spoke about the financial problems papers are having and the impact on reporting. He mentioned that there are fewer reporters in the capitol building to report on what's actually going on.

In addition, caucuses related to healthcare, domestic violence, gas drilling and local government consolidation were held at various times throughout the convention.

The League of Women Voters of Scarsdale (the "League") held its annual membership meeting on March 30, 2009 to evaluate the proposed Scarsdale Village budget for 2009-2010. We thank Village Manager, Al Gatta, and Village Treasurer, Mary Lou McClure for participating in our meeting and for giving the League a comprehensive overview of the various issues surrounding the development of the 2009-2010 budget.

The League commends the Mayor, Village Manager and the entire Village staff for their outstanding fiscal management. Current year non-tax revenue, including mortgage taxes, interest income, sales tax and building permit fees, declined dramatically. The outlook for FY2009-2010 remains unfavorable due to the economic environment. In response, Mr. Gatta took proactive steps and implemented cost cutting measures as early as September, 2008. Department managers made further adjustments and the League notes that going forward, the FY2009-2010 budget incorporates the following cost controls:

- A non-union salary freeze
- Reductions in overtime
- Scarsdale PBA salary increase deferrals until 2010-2011

These actions, in conjunction with a variety of non-personnel related cuts, have resulted in a 0.7% increase in projected expenditures for the proposed budget -- the smallest annual percentage increase in Scarsdale history. However, due to the aforementioned decline in revenue, the proposed tax increase for 2009-2010 is 7.64%. The League is pleased to note that the proposed tight expense controls within the budget should not have any significant impact on Village services.

Going forward, the League urges the Village to continue its efforts to renegotiate labor union contracts, especially those that are expiring in the next twelve months (PBA and Fire Workers unions). We also recommend that any additional personnel or operational cuts be carefully evaluated and discussed with the citizenry. It is essential to educate the community about how further reductions could impact Village services and infrastructure. In particular, during our consensus meeting, member support was strong for continued road improvements and further implementation of drainage and storm water management. Library, pool and recreational services were also deemed to be important resources for our community, especially during the current economic downturn.

The League commends the Village for undergoing a comprehensive assessment of its capital projects with a view towards "clawing back" funds that can be reallocated to new or other under-funded projects. Furthermore, we fully support the following Village initiatives to capitalize current and future projects via a variety of sources including, but not limited to:

- County grants
- Potential allocation of Federal stimulus funds
- Fixed income markets (currently at historically low rates)

In the next several years, many capital projects are expected to be financed through public bond issues. Therefore, it is of utmost importance that the Village carefully monitor its fund balance and maintain adequate reserves to ensure its AAA rating. A downgrading will have a significant negative impact on the Village's future interest and debt expenses. A strong fund balance will also ensure adequate contingency dollars.

The League has a long standing position supporting an equitable tax system for all taxpayers regardless of residence. To this end, we applaud the Village's efforts in advocating for district and county-wide property revaluations. We trust that Scarsdale Village will continue to collaborate with other municipalities and work toward a county-wide solution.

The League appreciates the Village's "open" budget briefing sessions which create valuable opportunities for community groups to become familiar with the complete budget process. We thank all the Village officials and administrators for the help they have given the League this year in its study of the proposed Village budget. We trust that you will consider our recommendations as you continue to refine and finalize the budget. The League supports the 2009-2010 Village budget and we look forward to participating in the budget process again next year.
